THERE'S a warm welcome awaiting sailors at **The Royal Hotel** in Campbeltown. The hotel is located at the head of Campbeltown Loch, just steps from the

Campbeltown yacht berthing pontoon (55° 25.90N, 05° 32.56W) on Scotland's Kintyre Peninsula. Originally built back in 1908, last year saw the completion of a painstaking restoration

of The Royal that combines the historic character of a landmark turn of the century hostelry with all of the contemporary conveniences of a modern hotel, now with 23 guest rooms, as well as quality

food and beverage at The Harbourview Grille and The Black Sheep Pub. Campbeltown is an excellent stopping off point for sailors heading round the Mull of Kintyre, crossing to or from

Ireland or cruising into the Clyde. The Royal Hotel has the following services available for sailors: Private Showers; Laundry Service; Free Wi-Fi; Food hampers; Weather reports and tide tables. In addition, the hotel is payment agent for berthing fees at Campbeltown Marina.

Campbeltown also features a variety of onshore activities including world class golf at Machrihanish Dunes Golf Club (club rentals and land transport available) and the Machrihanish Golf Club. Whisky tours and tastings are available at the Springbank and Glengyle distilleries.

● The **Loch Melfort** is a family run, comfortable and friendly hotel on the coast of Argyll, set amongst the stunning scenery of the Scottish West Highlands.

The hotel staff pride themselves on offering the best in service, tranquil accommodation, tasteful décor and a gourmet dining experience. All their rooms have magnificent sea views over Asknish Bay towards Jura, Shuna and Scarba which take the breath away.

The Asknish Bay Restaurant has been awarded two Rosettes by the AA every year since 2000. The restaurant is ardent about sourcing the best quality local ingredients for their menu and is cooked by head chef Colin MacDonald and his team.

Almost everything is home made at Loch Melfort Hotel, from bread, to marmalade, ice cream and even their own Scottish tablet, the exquisite local confectionary delight.

Before you sail, visit NTS Arduaine garden situated down the path next to Loch Melfort Hotel, well known for its rhododendrons and spectacular views across to Mull and neighbouring islands. After a light lunch in Chartroom II Bistro take a walk around the head of the loch, to the famous Wishing Tree in Melfort and over the hill to

Ardmaddy Castle and gardens or along the River Oude and Dam.

● Patricia Watt has owned, run and been the chef at the **Colintraive Hotel** for almost ten years, consistently offering home made food of an excellent standard while actively supporting all local products that include large Kyles of Bute langoustines, king size scallops from Loch Fyne and meat from the Island of Bute.

It's a hotel with a proper pub that always welcomes sailors. Open for food all day, there's also real ale on tap and log fires in the bar and restaurant.

The shop next door sells newspapers, fresh milk and bakery every day as well as local gifts and grocery products.

● Up at Sleat on the Isle of Skye, the culinary attributes of the **Duisdale House Hotel and Restaurant** beckon.

Five visitor moorings are available free of charge (max 15 tonnes) and crews going ashore can enjoy the menu in the Chartroom which specialises in Skye produce, from seafood to venison, all freshly prepared and cooked to order.

There are also dedicated showers for yotties together with washing and drying facilities for sailwear. Free WiFi facilities are available and if a shopping trip is required to Broadford, seven miles away, Duisdale House can arrange a taxi.
